## President's Message

Dear friends,

They say time flies when you are having a good time. As outgoing President, I can tell you that I must have been having a good time because the last two years have flown by. Being shul President has been an enriching experience for me, allowing me to contribute to the continuing successful development of our "warm and welcoming downtown traditional-egalitarian synagogue".

"If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am not for others, what am I? And if not now, when?"

Being President has meant that I've made the acquaintance of many shul members - on Shabbat, at holiday times, and at the many other events that go on at the shul. It's meant working with the dedicated members of your Board of Governors to make the many decisions necessary to keep the shul running smoothly, now and in the future. It's meant collaborating with the office staff to ensure their effective growing support of the membership and the Board of Governors.

What are the highlights? Here are some of the things I hope you are happy about:

- The ACCESSIBILITY Committee (sub-committee of Building) made a difference at this year's High Holy Day services and continues to look at other ways to improve accessibility.
- The FOOD Committee (sub-committee of Kiddush) has studied how our shul might change our relationship to the food we eat at the shul.
- ISRAEL AND COMMUNITY brought the *MAKOM* program and our Young Emissaries from Israel to the downtown Jewish community.
- HESED expanded its mandate to include meals for families with new babies.
- SOCIAL ACTION introduced the Mitzvah Mentor program so Narayever members who volunteer with other organizations can share their experience with other shul members who may be looking for ways to give back to the wider community.



- YOUTH revitalized our teen-led Shabbat programs for kids with a leadership development program, and introduced Family Services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.
  - BAR/BAT MITZVAH is revising the BBM guidelines in order to ensure the simchas celebrated at the shul provide an enriching experience for the families and the community.
  - CELEBRATIONS provided innovative programs for our major holidays and developed a comprehensive framework for future committees to use.
  - ADULT EDUCATION introduced parallel programming on Shabbat morning.
  - BUILDING challenged us to consider how to accommodate our existing membership and support accessibility for people with physical and other disabilities.
  - RITUAL is updating our policies and ensuring our sacred objects are maintained in the appropriate way (for example, three of our Torahs are being repaired!)
  - MEMBERSHIP continued to welcome new members, and has seen an increase in families with young children – Shabbat B'Yahad is so big it had to move downstairs!
  - COMMUNICATIONS is revitalizing our website so it better serves our "wired" community.
  - SPECIAL PROJECTS managed the sabbatical project which has enabled us to function smoothly while Rabbi Ed is away in Israel.
- All of this happened because members like you volunteer for the Board and their committees, because the Board members make the shul a priority in their lives, and because the office staff work as if they were in a family-owned business.

"Do not separate thyself from the community"

I am thankful for having had the opportunity to serve the shul as President; I could not have done so without the wholehearted support of my husband Ted and son Jess, and the members of the Executive Committee.

I wish the incoming President, Board and all the members of the shul all the best in the coming years.

## Rabbi's Message

Dear Friends,

Warm greetings from Jerusalem. I write at just about the midpoint of my 6 month sabbatical here in Israel. Linda, Tali, and I continue to learn so much every day, and to appreciate this extraordinary opportunity. Linda is researching an article at the Hebrew University library, Tali is going to her Grade 6 class at the local Israeli school (coincidentally called the Tali School!), and I am continuing to work on a project that I hope will enable me to better help both bar/bat mitzvah kids and adults write their own divrei torah based on traditional Jewish sources. I'm taking three classes -- one on Midrash, one on Jewish Law, and an advanced ulpan. In my free time, in addition to reading the Hebrew paper every day, I recently read David Grossman's *Mishehu LaRutz Ito*, which was a wonderful challenge for my Hebrew, and Hillel Halkin's enchanting biography of the medieval Hebrew poet and Zionist precursor Yehuda Halevi. Altogether, not a bad way for a rabbi to spend his time!



Three specific highlights from the last couple of months that I wanted to share with you...

Purim was very different in Israel. Not so much the actual megillah reading itself, but all the hoopla surrounding it – which stretched the celebration out to at least a week. On Purim and Shushan Purim, there were so many festivals and activities and carnivals around town that it was difficult to choose where to go, and everybody seemed to be in some kind of costume and ready to party. We really felt the impact of living in a Jewish society where the Jewish calendar is lived not just in the synagogue or in parochial school or in the confines of one's home but also on the streets and in the parks and in schools and in newspapers and shopping malls. It was truly a delight!

Another highlight was the few days I spent at the Jewish Agency together with our own Karen Weyman, and Debbie Cohen-Savage of the Paul Penna school, selecting our two new shinshinim for next year. Roni and Itai are both wonderful and enthusiastic young people, and I am sure they will do a great job building on the terrific work done

this year by our trailblazers Reut and Yuval. I know that not everybody is in a position to spend the kind of time that I have in Israel; our shul's participation in the MAKOM program enables us to bring a little bit of Israel to Toronto, and these great young people really represent the best that this country has to offer.

Finally, I was invited by Bernie Farber of the Canadian Jewish Congress to spend a few days travelling with him and a group of United Church of Canada ministers who were visiting Israel and the Palestinian territories as part of a fact-finding trip in preparation for a report to be delivered to the Church's next General Council. The United Church's deliberations on Israel have been troubling for many years, and I've had some involvement with this issue on both a local and a national level. It was good that

the group was open to hearing a different perspective on the conflict than the one that they had heard in the territories. What recommendations they bring remains to be seen.



I write in the wake of the recent terror attack near the Central Bus Station in Jerusalem, the murder of the Fogel family in the Itamar settlement, Judge Goldstone's partial retraction of his report to the UN on the Gaza "Cast Lead" operation, mass demonstrations in Syria, and great consternation over the Palestinian campaign to win UN recognition of their state in September. I also write as the whole country gears up to celebrate Pesach, which I anticipate will be even more all-consuming than Purim was. Israel continues to be a land of terrific promise, great joy, and heartbreaking tragedy.

We wish all our friends in Toronto a wonderful, well-deserved Spring.

After thousands of years, the stories of the Talmud and Midrash continue to amuse, perplex, scandalize and—most importantly—teach. From voices from the heavens, surprising engagements with history, intimate friendships to deep-set rivalries, these legends—epic and mundane, biographical and fanciful—reveal more than the content and context of Jewish learning: they disclose its very spirit. Get to know the vivid personalities of the ancient Rabbis, and explore central themes of the Jewish tradition: the spirit of Talmudic debate, the essence of community and ethics, the threats of idolatry and heresy, and more. No previous experience of the Talmud or knowledge of Hebrew is required.

He has worked and volunteered extensively in the environmental movement, and hosted and produced the award winning radio show Green Groove in Israel for three years.

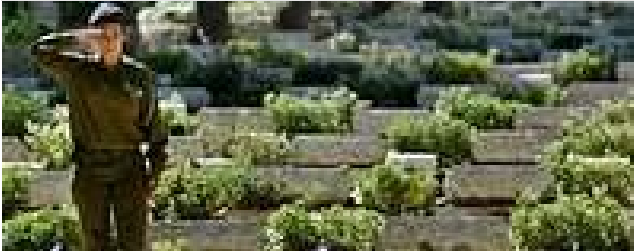

### Yom Ha'Zikaron



Please join us on Monday, May 9 from 7 to 8:30 pm at the shul as we commemorate those who gave their lives to achieve and protect an independent homeland for the Jewish people in Israel since 1860, and those who were victims of terror.
